HINTS FOR FLORAL ART Exhibits

An exhibit is composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories. Containers, drapes, exhibit titles and mechanics (wire, oasis, tape, etc.) may always be included in an exhibit, unless otherwise stated. Natural plant material should predominate. Flowers and foliage can be either from the garden, (but need not be grown by the exhibitor) and /or bought, (not dried).

RECIPE FOR SALT DOUGH - Class 180

225g plain flour

225g salt

Mix to a stiff paste with water and bake 8 hours (or overnight) in a cool oven 110c /225f. If decorated, please ensure the exhibit is dry before show entry.
